Tim also spent numerous hours producing the Baycats yearbook at the season end and compiling team and league stats for the future.

Over the years Tim never missed a game truly a hero behind the scenes.



THE JOHN CRAWLEY **DON COULSON** *Local Lifetime Achievement Award*

Don Coulson was a very active and involved leader in the Barrie and Simcoe County area since he arrived to play on the 1947-48 All Ontario/ Eastern Canada Midget NHL Champion.

Don helped form the Barrie Minor Athletic Club hockey and baseball teams in 1947 through the 50s. Don, with his brother and Mr. Law, was a major force in getting the first lighted baseball diamond at the fairgrounds where he played shortstop for the Barrie ACs. He then went on to become the league representative for 12 years.

Don also was the manager for the Barrie Flyers Jr A team from 1952-1956 then help to form a Intermediate A Falcons hockey club that then jumped to the Senior A league to be Allen Cup Champions.



Don also took the role as president of the Barrie Intermediate fastball league in 1959-64

In 1971- 77 Don was the board member and treasurer of the Barrie Winter Carnaval that was responsible for sports programming in Barrie

With his wife Joyce, he was co-founder of Barrie Minor Baseball in 1974 and a coach for many years following.

In his later years of hockey Don was the co founder of the Barrie Credit Union Oldtimers in 1975 that won the Canadian National Title twice and they represented Canada in tournaments in LA, Holland and Switzerland

Previously Don has been awarded the Rotary Unsung Hero in 1990 for his community work.

Also nominated for the Local Lifetime Achievement Award was Jo-Anne Eyers – an accomplished figure skater and coach with the Barrie Figure Skating Club and Mariposa School of Skating for 43 years. Her name will remain on the ballot for 2 years.

Kristy is a very accomplished and decorated Special Olympic athlete. In 2017, she won five Gold and one Silver in track and field at the Provincial Championships. The following year, at the 2018 Canada Summer Games in Winnipeg, Kristy won Gold in the 100m and 200m track event. Later that year she continued to excel at the National Summer Games in Nova Scotia, winning three Gold medals in track and field, including team relay and mini javelin.

Kristy's desire to reach the next level lead her to the Special Olympics in Abu Dhabi in 2019, where she won Silver in 100m track and Gold in javelin.

PAUL HOPPER/MARTIN MCCRONE Inductees: Builder



Paul has coached numerous Ontario Basketball teams including a Bronze medal in Division 1 with the Barrie Royals Major Midget Girls in 2008. He has coached and mentored four athletes that have received Division 1 scholarships. In 2015, Paul won the Marr Ross award for excellence in coaching basketball in Simcoe County by the Board of Education.

Martin has also coached basketball for over 30 years at elementary and high schools in Simcoe County, winning four Georgian Bay Secondary School Association titles

as a coach. He has also ran numerous basketball leagues and coached teams representing Ontario at many provincial tournaments. As a player, Martin won four GBSSA titles and played varsity basketball for three different universities. He was also a member of team that represented Canada at the World Masters Games in Australia.

The duo of Paul Hopper and Martin McCrone are being inducted together due to their strong dedication in working together to enhance the local basketball community. As coowners they ran Thunderhoops basketball camp for 27 years. As well, they have coached and mentored hundreds of athletes for many years across the county, providing a platform for young adults to enjoy and grow in a sport they also both love.

MIKE LAYCOCK

Mike Laycock was born in Barrie and developed as a goaltender during his years with the Barrie Minor Hockey Association. He was a member of the 1971-72 Major Bantam AA and 1972-73 Minor Midget AA teams which won back-to-back OMHA Championships. Mike made the jump to Junior hockey in 1974, playing for the Barrie Colts Jr. B team and was named the team's Most Valuable Player.

In 1975 Mike accepted a scholarship to attend the Ivy League's Brown University, located in Providence, Rhode Island. In 1977-78 Mike was named to the First Team All-Ivy, First Team All-ECAC and First Team All-American College Hockey Teams. Mike was inducted into the Brown University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989. Mike was selected in

the 12th round of the 1977 NHL draft by the Philadelphia Flyers. In 1979, Mike attended the Canadian Olympic Hockey Team selection camp before attending the Flyers training camp and was assigned to the Hampton Aces of the ECHL.

Mike was also an outstanding baseball/fastball player. In 1975 Mike was the youngest member of the Barrie Red Sox which represented Ontario at the Canadian Baseball Championships in Vancouver, BC. Mike was also an All-Star fastball catcher for various teams, winning several league championships and an OASA Intermediate AA Championship in 1978. In 1992 he was a member of the Barrie team which represented Ontario at the National Masters Slo-pitch Tournament in Calgary, Alberta in 1992. With his competitive days of baseball and hockey behind him, Mike returned to his roots and became a coach in the Barrie Minor Baseball and Barrie Minor Hockey Associations for 10 years.


