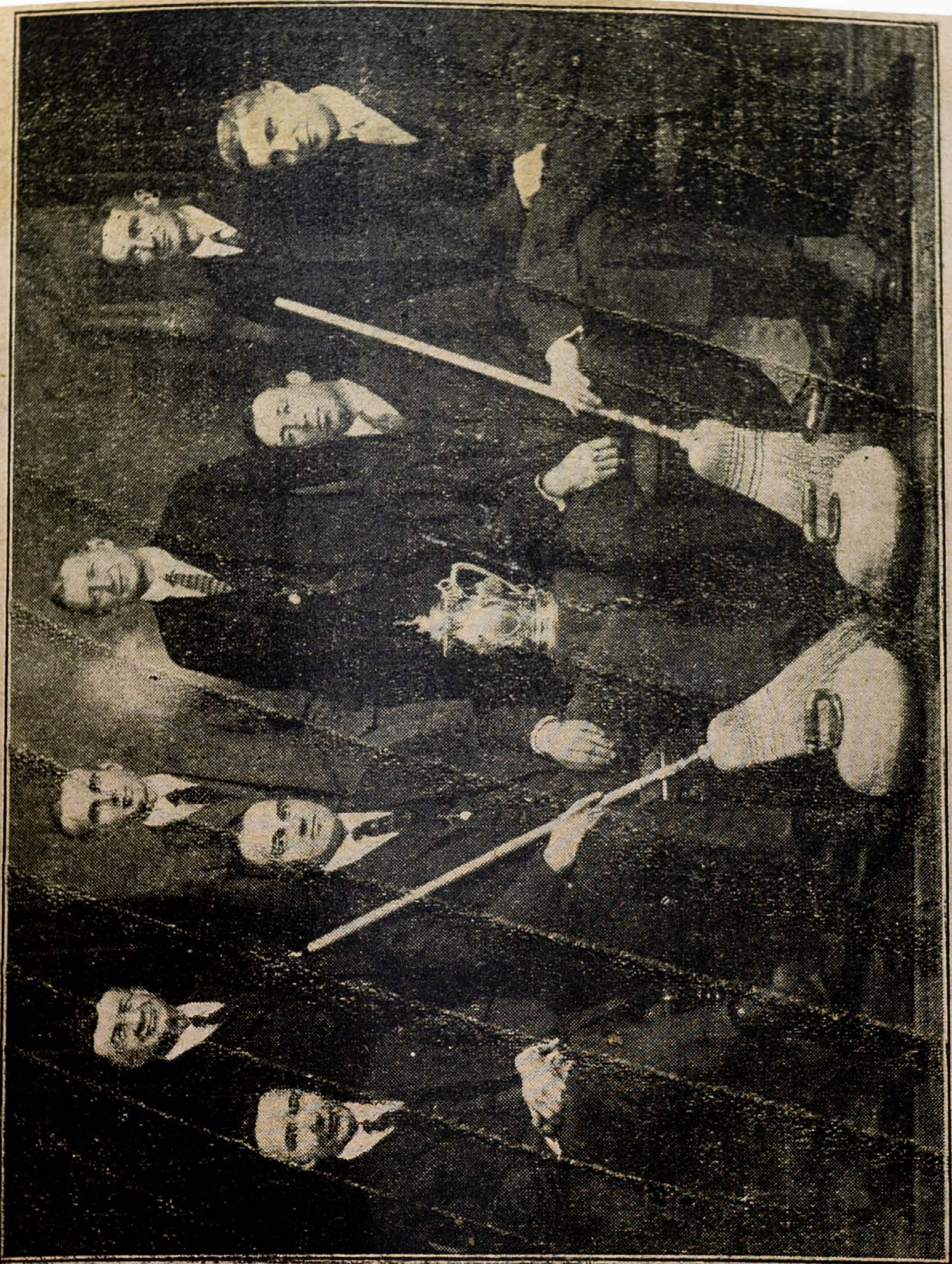

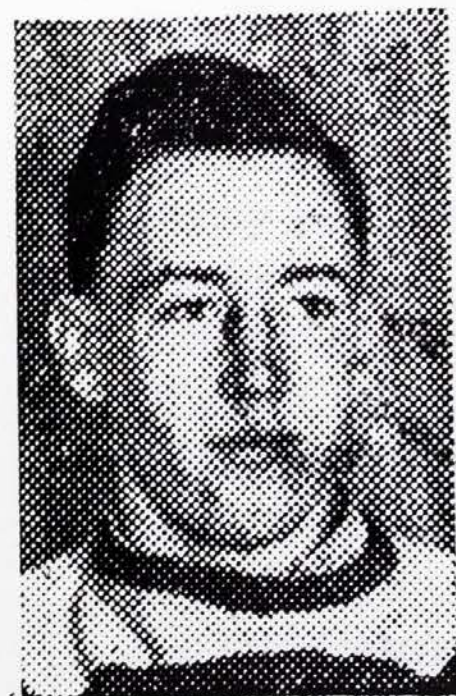

What is considered the best all homebrew junior hockey line Barrie Colts ever had in the long ice history of this town, has been reunited for the first time since 1938—but with Collingwood Shipbuilders in Intermediate A.

The above trio came out of Alandale as youths and literally burned up the puck lanes of the school and church leagues. Long and Scott moved up to the Colts in 1935-36 and Bowen came along the next year. They became the first string line for a great team which in two straight years—1937 and 1938, lost out in the OHA Junior B finals—to Norvocs and Kingston. The boys were quite good enough for Junior A of that time. Long always played left wing and took things fairly easy except when going in for a score. Scott originally played centre and was a left hand shot, while right-hander Bowen patrolled the right-rail. Coach Gord Meeking decided Bowen's only effective spot was centre and he was right. Dint Scott moved over to the right rail and although his wrong hand, did just as good a job as he used to do at centre and later did at left

wing. The boys collected many scoring points and the Scott-Bowen-Long trio became widely known, as they were generally all in on each tally.

Long was a year older than the others and he moved into senior hockey in 1938-39 but Bowen and Scott turned down many offers to remain home and play another season with the Colts. They won the SPA Trophy and beat a good Owen Sound club for district honors but lost to Oshawa Bees in the first playoff. From there the paths divided. Scott went to Collingwood Shipbuilders and Atlantic City Sea Gulls. Bowen played for Owen Sound Trappers and Belleville Redmen. Both eventually joined the Army and served overseas and have come back. Scott started the season with his old club at Collingwood and eventually got Bowen into action and finally lured Long out of several years' retirement. They were not on hand Saturday at Owen Sound when the Senior A Mohawks beat Shipbuilders 16-2 in an exhibition game or the score would not have been like that.

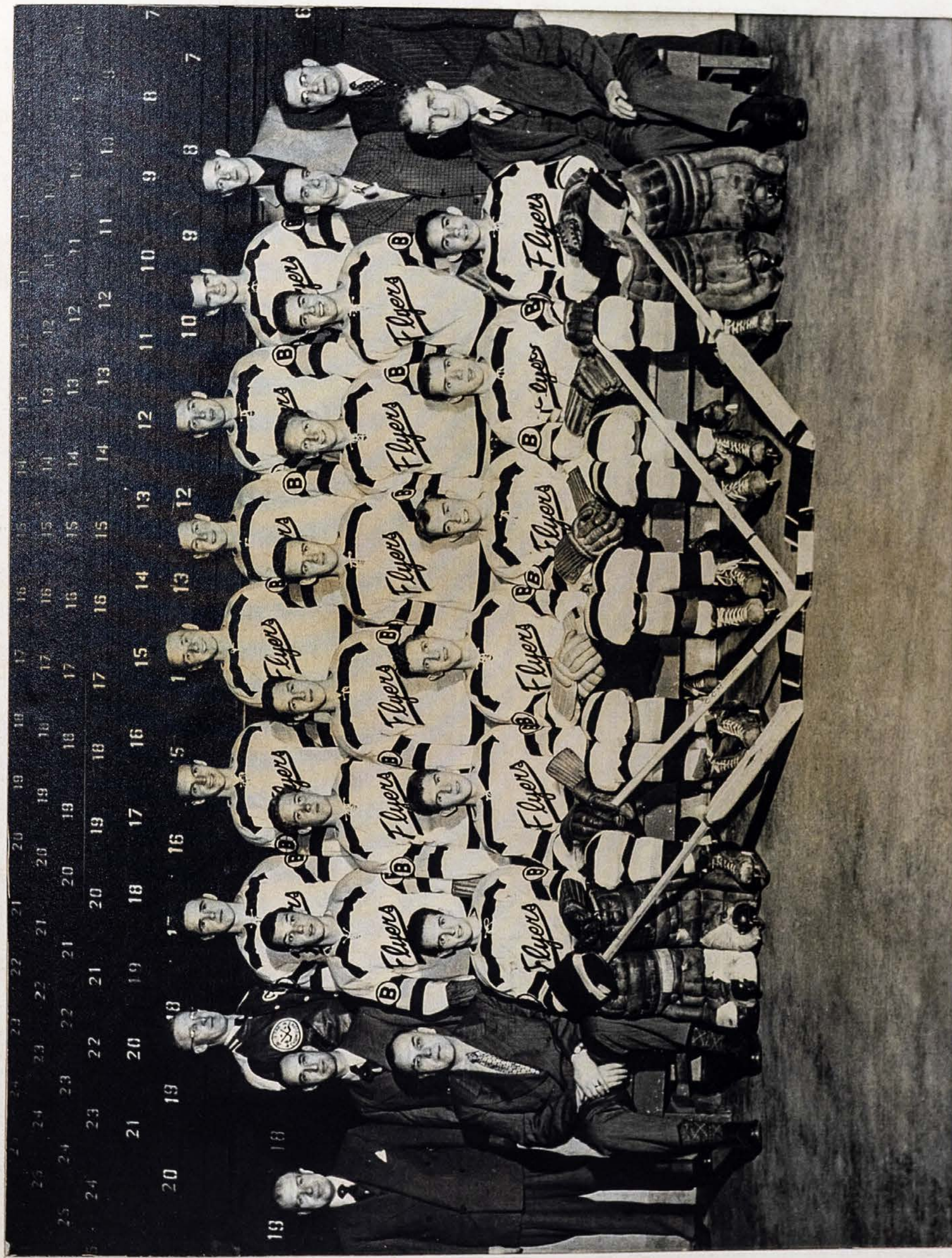

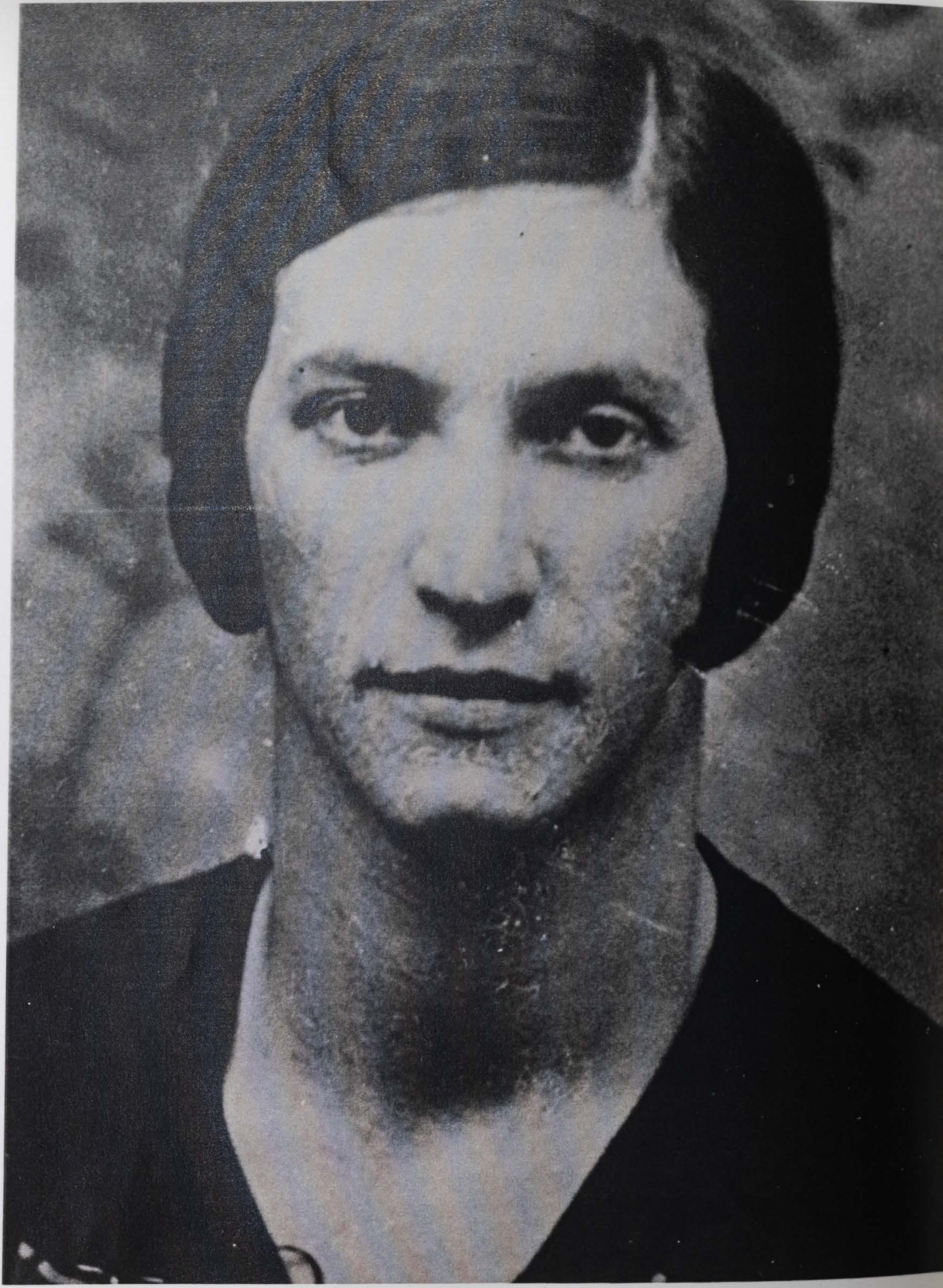
